The chart illustrates the percentage of smartphone brands market share in 2018 and 2020.

Overall, the biggest two brands remain the same in 2018 and 2020: Apple takes over the leadership, while Samsung in the second position. These two leading companies cover half the smartphone market while other smartphone brands account for the rest of the percentage.

Apple's, Samsung's and Xiaomi's percentage of market share has risen in 2020 and they cover 90 percent of the whole smartphone market; on the other hand, the rest has decreased, accounting for only 10 percent in 2020. Among the rest of the brands, HTC is the one that suffers the most significant decrease in market share, decreasing from 15% in 2018 to 5% in 2020.
